Dental Residents Receive Library Orientation and Training

On June 28th, incoming Pediatric Dentistry residents attended a library orientation and database training. The orientation focused on how to use library resources to find dental information. Topics included using the library catalog to search for books and journals, off-campus access to library resources, requesting materials the library doesn't have through Interlibrary Loan, and finding databases for research. Residents were shown how to use PubMed, a free database that comprises over 26 million citations for biomedical literature from MEDLINE, life science journals, and online books. They learned effective search strategies for their clinical questions and how to access many full-text articles via the UT Health Science Center Library.
